COCKBURN AREA AIR MONITORING PLAN

The Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER) continues to receive and respond to odour and dust complaints in the Cockburn area and we are very aware these issues are impacting some community members. To further investigate, we have this week begun our Cockburn Area Air Monitoring Plan – which will run until May this year.

The Plan will assist DWER to identify where dust and odours are coming from, any contributing weather conditions, who is being impacted and associated levels of annoyance. The Plan has four key Programs – including the Community Odour and Dust Monitoring Program, which is discussed below.

Invitation to community volunteers

As part of the Plan, and as a resident in the area shown in the enclosed map, you are invited to participate in our Community Odour and Dust Monitoring Program. The area of interest is bounded by Beeliar Drive in the north, Stock Road in the west, Fanstone and Fancote Avenues in the south and Kogolup Lake in the east.

We are seeking community volunteers to record and report any odour event they experience and any dust event they witness. Volunteers will be able to make all reports through a new online portal on our website. Results from the Program will be made publicly available on DWER's website at www.dwer.wa.gov.au/CAAMP.


